Epic Comic Strip

The Odyssey

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this assignment is for you to gain experience translating words to

images and in pacing a story.

Method: You will achieve this purpose by creating a **comic strip** based upon the characters,

events, and settings of *The Odyssey*.

<u>Details</u>: This assignment is due at the beginning of class on Tuesday 10/13 for "A" day or

Wednesday 10/14 for "B" day and is worth up to 50 points.

In order to earn the maximum grade: from 42 to 50 points, you must complete your comic strip **from** on one of the Books in the *Odyssey* that we have **not** read for class. If you choose to complete your comic from a Book that we have read in class, you may only earn a maximum grade of 41 points out of 50.

Remember, simply because you complete your comic strip on a book that we have not read for class, you are not guaranteed a grade of 42-50 out of 50 points. You must still comply with all of the criteria presented below.

Procedure:

Think deeply and creatively. The rubric will align with the directions below.

- Choose an event from within *The Odyssey*. Search for <u>5-10 exact textual excerpts</u> that will tell the event most concisely and effectively. You are not to paraphrase. You must use precise quotes from the text.
- Copy the selected excerpts onto a sheet of your own paper; decide what part of the quote can be cut and what must be in place for clarity and economy to tell the entire event.
- 3. Using your excerpts as a guide, sketch out 5-10 panels in which the action of the story will flow. Be sure the reader knows the order in which to read the panels—arrows help.
- 4. In the panels of your comic book, write out the excerpts you copied from the text. Be sure to leave enough room in the panels for the drawings. Not all panels need text.
- 5. Illustrate your event in as much detail as possible, **minimize blank space**. Your comic should contain striking images and symbols. Be creative. Be interesting.

You may use a computer program with a template.

Do not simply use stick figures if you can't draw, magnify faces or other items.
