Due to the fact that this novel is comprised of many letters, you will write me letters instead of keeping passage journals for Frankenstein; you will write four letters based on an assigned topic for each section of the book.

These letters must be typed, double spaced, in a12-point plain font and be one to two pages in length. Each letter must use four well-blended excerpts from that specific reading to support your ideas.

These letters should convey your reactions to the book as the tale unfolds. For each assigned reading section, you must also address the topic that accompany the assigned prompt, and you'll need a minimum of 2 concepts per letter are required, and you must discuss at least one use of language and how it affects the understanding of these ideas.

These letters should be a thorough analysis of each section. You may use any of the concepts that we have worked with throughout the year in order to facilitate a strong analysis of each section of the book.
