## Point of View (POV)

## The Stranger

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this assignment is for you to gain experience analyzing how a work of fiction is shaped by the narrator's point of view (POV).

<u>Method</u>: You will achieve this purpose by rewriting a scene from *The Stranger* using a different point of view (POV) than Camus has chosen to use.

Details: This assignment is due at the end of class and is worth 20-points.

## Procedure: You must use your own paper to complete this assignment.

- 1. Review the **following** four passages from *The Stranger*. After you have reviewed them, select the one that most interests you.
- Once you have chosen your passage, you need to re-write this passage from a different POV (perspective). What happens if it is told from 3<sup>rd</sup> person limited, 3<sup>rd</sup> person omniscient, or even in 1<sup>st</sup> person from a different character's perspective? You only need to re-write using **one** different POV.
- 3. Finally, after you have re-written your passage, you need to write an IEC Paragraph that discusses how, through re-writing your chosen passage, you have discovered how *The Stranger* is shaped by the narrator's point of view. You must use quotes from the passage that you have chosen.
- **Passage 1:** Meursalt is with the caretaker... page 6 last paragraph through top of page 7 until the end of that paragraph.
- Passage 2: The first time we meet Marie... page 19, beginning with, "While I was shaving...through "When the sun got too hot, she dove off and I followed."
- **Passage 3:** Meursalt on the beach... page 59, beginning with, "And this time, without getting up..." through the end of the page.
- **Passage 4:** The examining magistrate with Meursalt... page 68, beginning with, "Suddenly, he stood up..." through the end of the page.
